## Giving way in roundabouts

A driver entering a roundabout should always give way to a vehicle that is already in the roundabout. Enter a roundabout only when there is a safe gap in the traffic and no risk of a crash.

On multi-lane roundabouts, obey the directional arrows on the road.

You can change lanes within a roundabout, but you must indicate and give way to other vehicles.

Cyclists & roundabouts: When entering multi-lane roundabout, cyclists should move to the centre of their chosen lane.

Motorists entering a roundabout should be aware of cyclists and not attempt to squeeze past or overtake them.

### Penalty

Failure to give way:  
3 demerit points and  
\$150 infringement
