## When you need to indicate

Indicating may seem like a small thing, but forgetting to do it can cause big problems.

Indicating at the right time and place tells everyone where you're heading. Know the road rules of when you must indicate:

- Turning right or left
- Changing lanes
- Overtaking
- At a roundabout
- Merging when your lane ends
- Entering or leaving a parking space
- Pulling into or out from a kerb or roadside
- Making a U-turn or 3-point turn

Remember to give enough warning of your intention to change direction to allow other drivers, motorcyclists, bicycle riders and pedestrians to act on your signal. And always proceed with care.
